





## **INTRODUCTION**

## INTRODUCTION

### ***What is the Inventory of Agencies and Services for Immigrants and Visible Minorities in Peel Region?***

The Inventory is a listing of social services that are available to the new immigrant population in Peel.

The Inventory provides information about the services and programs in the following areas:

- Name of agency providing the service/program (includes address, phone, fax etc.)
- Types of programs offered (settlement, employment and other services)
- General information on the programs (when offered, where offered, cost, etc.)

### ***For whom is the inventory written?***

The Inventory is written primarily for service providers and funders in Peel. It is hoped that they can use the Inventory for program planning, service delivery, and simply finding out services are available to particular groups of immigrants in Peel Region.

### ***What are the limitations of the inventory?***

The primary focus of the inventory is for those agencies serving the most recent, and dominant immigrant groups in Peel. These are primarily visible minority groups, and the Polish and Portuguese groups.

The Inventory is not comprehensive. Non-profit organizations and community groups are constantly developing new programs and services throughout the year; hence the Inventory will need to be updated on an annual basis. It is acknowledged that other agencies (the “mainstream” agencies) may be providing services to the new immigrant population; however, for the purposes of this research they are not included at this time.

### ***How was the inventory compiled?***

The main source of information for the Inventory was the Peel Information Systems Group - Community Information Database, (March 1999).

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON PEEL'S IMMIGRANT POPULATION

### Immigration

The engine of Peel's population growth is immigration: 62.1% of the growth of the Peel population between 1991 and 1996 was due to immigration. Furthermore, the immigrant population in Peel will continue to grow, and at a much higher rate than Peel's general population. In the 1990's, the majority of the new immigrants coming into Peel were from Asian countries. Another feature of Peel's immigrant population is the difference in residential patterns of immigrant groups. For example, the second largest immigrant group in Mississauga is an Eastern-European group, namely the Polish; while in Brampton the second largest immigrant group is a Caribbean group, with Jamaica as a lead component of that group.

#### *How many immigrants live in Peel?*

In 1996, 339,370 people in Peel reported that they were born outside of Canada (i.e., they are immigrants).

#### *What proportion of Peel's population is immigrant?*

In 1996, 39.8% of Peel's total population was comprised of immigrants, up from the 1991 figure of 36.2%. By comparison, 25.3% of Ontario's population (or 2,724,485) was comprised of immigrants in 1996.

#### *What proportion of the total immigrant population in Ontario is settled in Peel?*

Approximately 12.5% of Ontario's immigrant population resides in Peel (1996).

#### *Has the number of immigrants in Peel increased since the 1991 Census of Canada?*

- Yes. Between the 1991 and 1996 Census of Canada, the number of people living in Peel who were born outside of Canada increased by 28.0%, a growth of 74,135 people (from 265,055 to 339,370). This rate of growth outstripped that of the general rate of population growth in Peel in the same period, which was 16.3%.
- 62.1% of Peel's population growth between 1991 and 1996 was due to immigration into Peel (74,315 of 119,727).

***What countries do immigrants to Peel come from?***

- The major sources for immigrants to Peel have shifted, from the United Kingdom, the Caribbean, and the United States in the 1980's, to India and Southeast Asia in the 1990's.
- For Peel Region as a whole, the five major source countries for immigrants were India, Poland, the Philippines, Hong Kong, and Sri Lanka (1996).
- In 1996, the five major sources of new immigrants to Mississauga were, in rank order, India, Poland, Hong Kong, the Philippines, and Sri Lanka.
- In Brampton, the top five major source countries for immigrants were India, Jamaica, Trinidad & Tobago, the Philippines, and Guyana (1996).

***What percentage of the immigrants in Peel speak English or French?***

The proportion of immigrants to Peel who speak English or French increased between 1992 and 1996.

- In 1996, 57.4% of immigrants arriving in Peel could speak English or French.
  - 1995 – 60.4% could speak English or French
  - 1994 – 56%
  - 1993 – 55%
  - 1992 – 59%
- Brampton has a higher proportion of newcomers who cannot speak English than does Mississauga.

***What is the educational background of immigrants to Peel?***

The adult immigrant population of Peel is a relatively well-educated one. However, there is a polarization among new immigrants arriving in Peel. A significant proportion (12.2%) has less than Grade Nine, while an equally significant proportion (11.7%) has more than 13 years of schooling. Since 1994, however, the proportion of new immigrants with less than nine years of schooling is declining, while the proportion with secondary and post-secondary schooling is increasing.

- In 1996, 10.2% of the newcomers to Peel had less than nine years of schooling.
- In 1996, 53.8% of the new immigrants coming into Peel reported having post-secondary education: 37.0 had the equivalent of a college/university education; 16.7% had post-graduate or Master's level education and above.
- One group of immigrants that has increased significantly is the post-graduate group (those with 17 or more years of schooling). In 1992, they accounted for 10.5% of the age 15+ immigrant population intending to work; in 1996, that figure had risen to 16.7%.

- With respect to location within Peel, more of the highly educated newcomers are destined to go to Mississauga than to Brampton. Brampton tends to have a higher number of newcomers with limited schooling (less than nine years), than does Mississauga.

*Will the number of immigrants to Peel increase in the future?*

Yes. According to the Region of Peel's Planning Department, the growth in the number of immigrants living in Peel will accelerate between 1996 and 2001, to reach an anticipated 380,000 immigrants. This growth, if it does happen, will represent a growth rate of 12 % within Peel's immigrant population. (Please note that this is a very conservative estimate, given the fact that the growth rate for 1991-1996 was 28.4%).

*Will the proportion of Peel's population comprised of immigrants increase in the future?*

Yes. The Region of Peel's Planning Department estimates that by the year 2001, the proportion of Peel's total population comprised of immigrants will be about 40%.

### **RECENT CHANGES IN IMMIGRATION TO PEEL: THE GROWTH OF THE VISIBLE MINORITY POPULATION**

Four decades ago, Peel was a small, rural, Anglo-Celtic (White) Christian community. Today it has a population of almost one million people. That population is highly multiracial, multicultural, multilingual and multifaith. According to the 1996 Census of Canada, 265,095 people in Peel were Visible Minorities (Non-white people); they represented 30% of Peel's total population.

- In 1961, there were 38,895 immigrants in Peel. Only 2% of these (840 persons) were Visible Minorities
- Between 1991 and 1996, Visible Minorities represented 78% (57,815) of the immigrants arriving in Peel.

The social or human services sector in Peel (social service agencies, community-based non-profit groups, hospitals, police etc.) came into being in the late 1960's at a time when Peel was still a relatively small, White community. It then developed over the years to meet the needs of that community.

Today, however, Peel's human services sector has to accommodate and be responsive to the many different groups of non-European immigrants and Visible Minorities. This means being sensitive to issues of difference in culture, language, religion, and race relations.

A quick examination of Peel's human services at the end of 1999 clearly shows the following pattern of service provision:

- A. **“Mainstream” agencies** serving all residents of Peel
- B. **Neighbourhood Community Centres** which, while being “mainstream” themselves, that is, open to serving all residents of Peel, also have programs and services specifically for new immigrants
- C. **Ethno-specific agencies** and social groups specializing in provision of settlement and other services to particular ethnic/immigrant groups.
- D. **Multi-ethnic settlement agencies**, specializing in the provision of settlement and other services to the immigrant population as a whole.
