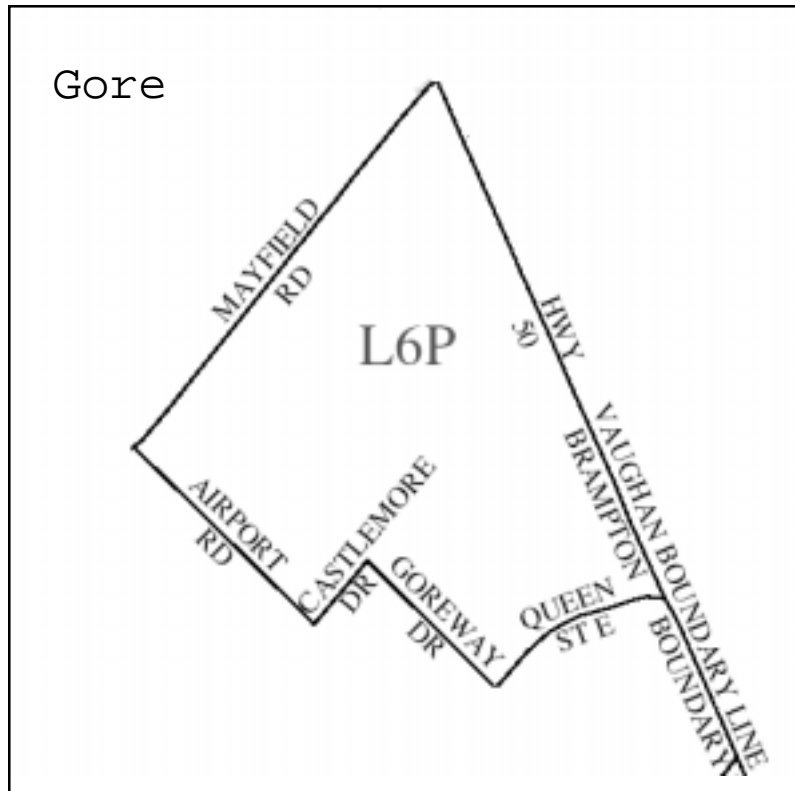

- In 2001, the top five mother tongue languages after English were Punjabi, Italian, Tagalog, Gujarati, and Croatian.

- In 2001, 9.4% of the Gore population had achieved only a grade nine level of education or less.
- 27.8% of the Gore population reported completion of high school as their highest level of education.
- 6.6% of the Gore population reported their highest level of education to be certification in the skilled trades.
- 25.3% of the Gore population reported their highest level of education at the college level.
- 30.6% of the population reported their highest level of education at the university level.
- 22.2% of the Gore population (aged 20 years and above) reported having a Bachelor's degree or higher.

- In 2001, the labour force in Gore consisted of 1,190 persons over age 15.
- The labour force participation rate for Gore in 2001 was 75.3%. The comparative rate for Peel in 2001 was 73.5%.
- In 2001, there were 1,165 people employed in Gore.
- Gore's unemployment rate in 2001 for people aged 15 and over was 2.1%. By comparison, in Peel in 2001, the unemployment rate was 5.1%.

- In 2000, there were approximately 135 persons in private households living on low incomes. The 135 low-income persons represented approximately 6.0% of the total population in 2000.
- In 2000, there were 25 low-income families in Gore. The 25 families comprised approximately 4.5% of the total number of census families in Gore.
- There was a higher incidence of low income among individuals in private households than among families in 2000: 6.0% versus 4.5%, respectively.
