- Between 1996 and 2001, the number of legally married (and not separated) people in Caledon (Urban) increased by 134.5%, (from 580 to 1,360 people).
- The number of widowed people increased by 300.0% between 1996 and 2001.
- The number of divorced or separated people increased by 163.6%, (from 55 to 145) in the same period.
- Overall, the widowed group in Caledon (Urban) is growing at a higher rate than the married group.

Highlights:

- Overall, unemployment declined significantly between 1996 and 2001 in Caledon (Urban).
- In 2001, the labour force in Caledon (Urban) consisted of 1,580 persons over age 15, an increase of 145.0% over the 645 persons in the labour force in 1996.
- The labour force participation rate for Caledon (Urban) in 2001 was 76.9% compared to 84.9% in 1996. The comparative rate for Peel in 2001 was 73.5%.
- In 2001, there were 1,560 people employed in Caledon (Urban), an increase of 153.7% from the 615 employed people in 1996.
- Caledon (Urban)'s unemployment rate in 2001 for people aged 15 and over was 1.3%, down from the 1996 rate of 4.7%. By comparison, in Peel in 2001, the unemployment rate was 5.1%.

Highlights:

- The average family income in Caledon (Urban) was \$97,871 in 2000, an increase of 27.5% from the average family income of \$75,775 in 1995.
- Overall in Caledon (Urban), families with higher incomes are growing at a faster rate than families with lower incomes.
- The highest rate of growth occurred among families that earned \$20,000 to \$49,999. This group increased by 950.0% between 1995 and 2000, from 10 to 105.
- In 2000, 81.9% of families in Caledon (Urban) earned more than \$50,000 per year, compared to 88.5% in 1995.
- The number of families that earned less than \$20,000 increased by 60.0%, and the number of families that earned \$50,000 and over increased by 142.6%.

Highlights:

- The number of individuals in private households living on low incomes increased by 600% between 1995 and 2000.
- The number of families living on low incomes increased by 350% between 1995 and 2000.
- Overall, the incidence of low income among individuals in private households and families in Caledon (Urban) rose between 1995 and 2000.
- In 2000, there were approximately 175 persons in private households living on low incomes. The 175 low-income persons represented approximately 6.5% of the total population in 2000, compared to 2.2% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 45 low-income families in Caledon (Urban). The 45 families comprised approximately 5.9% of the total number of families in Caledon (Urban), compared to 3.4% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 10 unattached individuals living on low incomes in Caledon (Urban) compared to 0 in 1995. They represented 25.0% of all unattached individuals in Caledon (Urban) in 2000.
- There was a higher incidence of low income among unattached individuals than among families in 2000: 25.0% versus 5.9%, respectively.
