- The number of people with English as their first language increased by 24.2%, while the number of those with non-English first languages increased by 39.3%.
- In 2001, the top five mother tongue languages after English were Italian, German, Portuguese, Polish, and Punjabi.
- The greatest population increase occurred among Spanish-speakers (233.3%), Croatian-speakers (185.0%), and Punjabi-speakers (85.3%).

- The number of widowed people increased by 25.5% between 1996 and 2001.
- The number of divorced or separated people increased by 35.3%, (from 2,195 to 2,970) in the same period.
- The divorced or separated group is growing at a much faster rate than the other groups. The lowest growth rate is within the married group.

- In 2001, 5.7% of the Town of Caledon population had achieved only a grade nine level of education or less; the comparative figure for Peel in 2001 was 7.6%.
- 30.6% of the Town of Caledon population reported completion of high school as their highest level of education; the comparative figure for Peel in 2001 was 29.5%.
- 11.4% of the Town of Caledon population reported their highest level of education to be certification in the skilled trades; the comparative figure for Peel in 2001 was 9.4%.
- 28.1% of the Town of Caledon population reported their highest level of education at the college level; the comparative figure for Peel in 2001 was 24.5%.
- 24.3% of the Town of Caledon population reported their highest level of education at the university level; the comparative figure for Peel in 2001 was 29.0%.
- 17.3% of the Town of Caledon population (aged 20 years and above) reported having a Bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 20.7% in Peel.

Highlights:

- Overall, unemployment declined between 1996 and 2001 in the Town of Caledon.
- In 2001, the labour force in the Town of Caledon consisted of 28,900 persons over age 15, an increase of 31.0% over the 22,750 persons in the labour force in 1996.
- The labour force participation rate for the Town of Caledon in 2001 was 76.9%, compared to 74.5% in 1996. The comparative rate for Peel in 2001 was 73.5%.
- In 2001, there were 28,825 people employed in the Town of Caledon, an increase of 33.6% from the 21,525 employed people in 1996.
- the Town of Caledon's unemployment rate in 2001 for people aged 15 and over was 3.3%, down from the 1996 rate of 5.2%.

Highlights:

- The average family income in the Town of Caledon was \$98,325 in 2000, an increase of 25.2% from the average family income of \$78,522 in 1995.
- Overall in the Town of Caledon, families with higher incomes are growing at a faster rate than families with lower incomes.
- The highest rate of growth occurred among families that earned more than \$50,000 per year. This group increased by 43.3% between 1995 and 2000, from 8,120 to 11,640.
- In 2000, 79.2% of families in the Town of Caledon earned more than \$50,000 per year, compared to 71.4% in 1995.
- The remaining family income groups decreased: the number of families that earned less than \$20,000 decreased by 12.2%, and the number of families that earned \$20,000 to \$49,999 decreased by 4.4%.

Highlights:

- Overall, while the number of individuals and families living on low incomes increased, the percentage of these groups decreased (with the exception of those individuals living alone/unattached individuals).
- The number of individuals in private households living on low incomes increased by 25% between 1995 and 2000.
- The number of families living on low incomes increased by 17.2% between 1995 and 2000.
- In 2000, there were approximately 2,305 persons in private households living on low incomes. The 2,305 low-income persons represented approximately 4.6% of the total population in 2000, compared to 4.7% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 545 low-income families in the Town of Caledon. The 545 families comprised approximately 3.8% of the total number of families in the Town of Caledon, compared to 4.2% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 425 unattached individuals living on low incomes in the Town of Caledon compared to 305 in 1995. They represented 17.3% of all unattached individuals in the Town of Caledon in 2000.
- There was a higher incidence of low income among unattached individuals than among families in 2000: 17.3% versus 3.8%, respectively.
