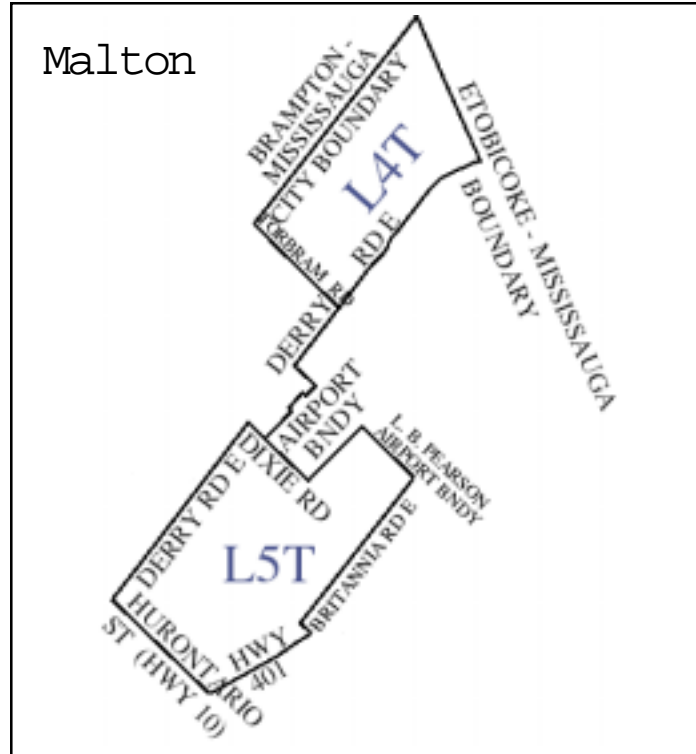

- In 2001, there were 28,375 visible minority persons living in Malton (compared to 23,710 in 1996).
- In 2001, 69.0% of Malton's population was comprised of visible minorities (compared to 60.8% in 1996).
- The number of visible minorities in Malton increased by 19.7% between 1996 and 2001.
- In 2001, the three largest groups of visible minorities in Malton were South Asians (17,670), Blacks (6,295), and Latin Americans (695).
- The three fastest growing visible minority groups in Malton are the Southeast Asians, Arab/West Asians, and Japanese.

### Highlights:

- Less than half of the residents of Malton (45.4%) indicated that English was their mother tongue (first language).
- The number of people with English as their first language declined by 0.8%, while the number of those with non-English first languages increased by 13.7%.
- In 2001, the top five mother tongue languages after English were Punjabi, Italian, Urdu, Gujarati, and Tamil.
- The greatest population increase occurred among Vietnamese-speakers (246.7%), Gujarati-speakers (163.1%), and Urdu-speakers (124.6%).

- The number of single adults in Malton (never/not yet married) increased by 4.8%, (from 9,045 to 9,480), between 1996 and 2001.
- Between 1996 and 2001, the number of legally married (and not separated) people in Malton increased by 4.9%, (from 17,375 to 18,225 people).
- The number of widowed people increased by 11.7% between 1996 and 2001, and the number of divorced or separated people increased by 12.0%, (from 2,295 to 2,570) in the same period.
- Overall, the group of widowed and divorced/separated people in Malton is growing at a higher rate than both the married and single groups.

- In 2001, the labour force in Malton consisted of 21,850 persons over age 15, an increase of 5.6% over the 20,690 persons in the labour force in 1996.
- The labour force participation rate for Malton in 2001 was 69.3% compared to 69.1% in 1996.
- In 2001, there were 20,425 people employed in Malton, an increase of 10.6% from the 18,745 employed people in 1996.

**Highlights:**

- The average family income in Malton was \$50,700 in 2000, an increase of 11.2% from the average family income of \$45,602 in 1995.
- Overall in Malton, families with higher incomes are growing at a faster rate than families with lower incomes.
- The highest rate of growth occurred among families that earned \$50,000 and over. This group increased by 24.0% between 1995 and 2000, from 4,035 to 5,005.
- In 2000, 44.0% of families in Malton earned more than \$50,000 per year, compared to 38.8% in 1995.
- The number of families that earned less than \$20,000 decreased by 19.8%, and the number of families that earned \$20,000 to \$49,999 increased by 10.7%.

**Highlights:**

- The number of individuals in private households living on low incomes decreased by 10.8% between 1995 and 2000.
- The number of families living on low incomes decreased by 8.6% between 1995 and 2000.
- Overall, the incidence of low income among individuals in private households and families in Malton declined between 1995 and 2000.
- In 2000, there were approximately 8,385 persons in private households living on “low incomes.” The 8,385 low-income persons represented approximately 20.5% of the total population in 2000, compared to 24.1% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 1,970 low-income families in Malton. The 1,970 families comprised approximately 20.1% of the total number of families in Malton, compared to 23.1% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 990 unattached individuals living on “low incomes” in Malton compared to 925 in 1995. They represented 45.0% of all unattached individuals in Malton in 2000.
- There was a higher incidence of low income among unattached individuals than among families in 2000, 45.0% versus 20.1%, respectively.
