

- In 2001, 31.6% of Meadowvale's population was comprised of visible minorities (compared to 22.6% in 1996).
- The number of visible minorities in Meadowvale increased by 86.4% between 1996 and 2001.
- In 2001, the three largest groups of visible minorities in Meadowvale were South Asians (9,495), Blacks (5,665), and Chinese (2,885).
- The three fastest growing visible minority groups in Meadowvale are the Koreans, Filipinos, and South Asians.

- The majority of Meadowvale residents (68.3%) indicated that English was their mother tongue (first language).
- The number of people with English as their first language increased by 19.4%, while the number of those with non-English first languages increased by 83.2%.
- In 2001, the top five mother tongue languages after English were Polish, Chinese, Portuguese, Punjabi, and Urdu.
- The greatest population increase occurred among Urdu-speakers (228.0%), Polish-speakers (167.8%), and Punjabi-speakers (142.9%).

- The number of widowed people increased by 38.5% between 1996 and 2001, and the number of divorced or separated people increased by 27.3% in the same period.

- Overall, unemployment declined between 1996 and 2001 in Meadowvale.
- In 2001, the labour force in Meadowvale consisted of 49,365 persons over age 15, an increase of 35.0% over the 36,560 persons in the labour force in 1996.
- The labour force participation rate for Meadowvale in 2001 was 79.0% compared to 78.9% in 1996. The comparative rate for Peel in 2001 was 73.5%.
- In 2001, there were 47,180 people employed in Meadowvale, an increase of 38.4% from the 34,080 employed people in 1996.
- Meadowvale's unemployment rate in 2001 for people aged 15 and over was 4.4%, down from the 1996 rate of 6.8%. By comparison, in Peel in 2001, the unemployment rate was 5.1%.

- In 2000, there were approximately 6,965 persons in private households living on low incomes. The 6,965 low-income persons represented approximately 8.3% of the total population in 2000.
- In 2000, there were 1,590 low-income families in Meadowvale. The 1,590 families comprised approximately 7.0% of the total number of census families in Meadowvale.
- In 2000, there were 1,060 unattached individuals living on low incomes in Meadowvale. They represented 23.3% of all unattached individuals in Meadowvale in 2000.
- There was a higher incidence of low income among unattached individuals than among families in 2000, 23.3% versus 7.0%, respectively.
