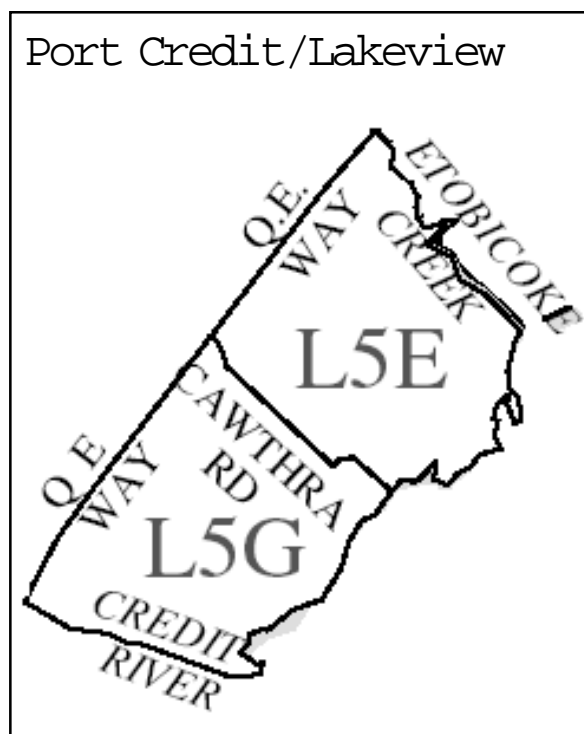

- The fastest growing age group in Port Credit/Lakeview is the 45 to 64 age group: 13.7% increase between 1996 and 2001.
- In contrast to the rapidly growing elderly population, the 0-14 age group declined by 3.7% between 1996 and 2001.

- In 2001, 10,335 or 31.8% of Port Credit/Lakeview's total population was comprised of immigrants, up from the 1996 figure of 30.7%.
- The immigrant population is growing at a faster rate than the Canadian-born (non-immigrant) population: 5.4% versus 0.6% between 1996 and 2001.

- In 2001, 12.3% of Port Credit/Lakeview's population was comprised of visible minorities (compared to 11.4% in 1996).
- The number of visible minorities in Port Credit/Lakeview increased by 10.0% between 1996 and 2001.
- In 2001, the three largest groups of visible minorities in Port Credit/Lakeview were South Asians (1,005), Blacks (895), and Filipinos (565).
- The three fastest growing visible minority groups in Port Credit/Lakeview are the South Asians, Chinese, and Filipinos.

- The majority of Port Credit/Lakeview residents (67.8%) indicated that English was their mother tongue (first language).
- The number of people with English as their first language increased by 0.3%, while the number of those with non-English first languages increased by 10.5%.
- In 2001, the top five mother tongue languages after English were Polish, Portuguese, Italian, Croatian, and Spanish.
- The greatest population increase occurred among Ukrainian-speakers (54.2%), Croatian-speakers (48.2%), and Serbo-Croatian-speakers (36.8%).

- The number of single adults in Port Credit/Lakeview (never/not yet married) increased by 9.4%, (from 7,530 to 8,235), between 1996 and 2001.
- Between 1996 and 2001, the number of legally married (and not separated) people in Port Credit/Lakeview declined by 0.5%, (from 13,780 to 13,715 people).
- The number of divorced or separated people increased by 8.2%, (from 2,920 to 3,160) in the same period.
- Overall, the group of single people in Port Credit/Lakeview is growing at a faster rate than the other groups.

- In 2001, 63.5% of the 12,910 private occupied dwellings in Port Credit/Lakeview were owned, and 36.5% were rented (compared to 59.9% and 40.1%, respectively in 1996).
- Home ownership in Port Credit/Lakeview increased by 10.9%, between 1996 and 2001, while home rentals decreased by 4.7% in the same period.

- Among apartments, those in apartment buildings with five or more storeys were the most common type in Port Credit/Lakeview (33.8%) in 2001.
- In 2001, row houses accounted for 4.2% and semi-detached houses accounted for 2.4% of the dwellings in Port Credit/Lakeview.

- 31.9% of the Port Credit/Lakeview population reported completion of high school as their highest level of education.
- 10.5% of the Port Credit/Lakeview population reported their highest level of education to be certification in the skilled trades.
- 22.1% of the Port Credit/Lakeview population reported their highest level of education at the college level.
- 27.2% of the population reported their highest level of education at the university level.
- 19.6% of the Port Credit/Lakeview population (aged 20 years and above) reported having a Bachelor's degree or higher.

Highlights:

- Overall, unemployment declined between 1996 and 2001 in Port Credit/Lakeview.
- In 2001, the labour force in Port Credit/Lakeview consisted of 18,795 persons over age 15, an increase of 8.4% over the 17,335 persons in the labour force in 1996.
- The labour force participation rate for Port Credit/Lakeview in 2001 was 70.1% compared to 66.6% in 1996. The comparative rate for Peel in 2001 was 73.5%.
- In 2001, there were 17,950 people employed in Port Credit/Lakeview, an increase of 11.7% from the 16,070 employed people in 1996.
- Port Credit/Lakeview's unemployment rate in 2001 for people aged 15 and over was 4.5%, down from the 1996 rate of 7.3%. By comparison, in Peel in 2001, the unemployment rate was 5.1%.

Highlights:

- The average family income in Port Credit/Lakeview was \$83,527 in 2000, an increase of 29.9% from the average family income of \$64,308 in 1995.
- Overall in Port Credit/Lakeview, families with higher incomes are growing at a faster rate than families with lower incomes.
- The highest rate of growth occurred among families that earned \$50,000 and over. This group increased by 30.6% between 1995 and 2000, from 4,715 to 6,160.
- In 2000, 65.7% of families in Port Credit/Lakeview earned more than \$50,000 per year, compared to 52.1% in 1995.
- The remaining family income groups decreased: the number of families that earned less than \$20,000 decreased by 26.0%, and the number of families that earned \$20,000 to \$49,999 decreased by 25.8%.

- The number of families living on low incomes decreased by 30.9% between 1995 and 2000.
- Overall, the incidence of low income among individuals and families in Port Credit/Lakeview declined between 1995 and 2000.
- In 2000, there were approximately 3,940 persons in private households living on low incomes. The 3,940 low-income persons represented approximately 12.1% of the total population in 2000, compared to 17.5% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 960 low-income families in Port Credit/Lakeview. The 960 families comprised approximately 10.4% of the total number of families in Port Credit/Lakeview, compared to 15.5% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 1,185 unattached individuals living on low incomes in Port Credit/Lakeview compared to 1,250 in 1995. They represented 27.5% of all unattached individuals in Port Credit/Lakeview in 2000.
- There was a higher incidence of low income among unattached individuals than among families in 2000: 27.5% versus 10.4%, respectively.
