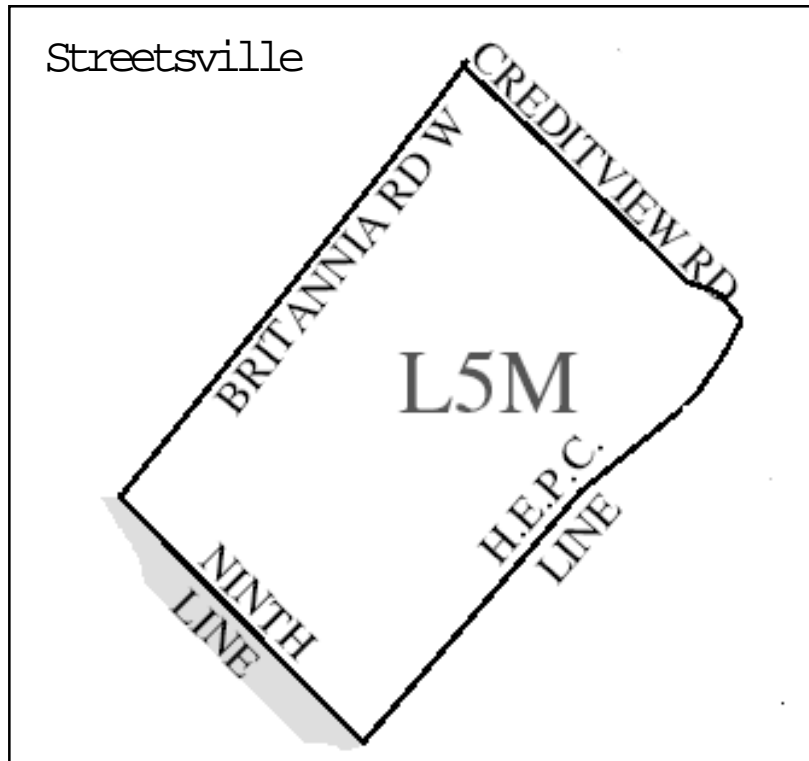

### Highlights:

- In 2001, there were 24,470 visible minority persons living in Streetsville (compared to 15,255 in 1996).
- In 2001, 44.2% of Streetsville's population was comprised of visible minorities (compared to 36.7% in 1996).
- The number of visible minorities in Streetsville increased by 60.7% between 1996 and 2001.
- In 2001, the three largest groups of visible minorities in Streetsville were South Asians (8,630), Chinese (5,670), and Blacks (2,775).
- The three fastest growing visible minority groups in Streetsville are the Southeast Asians, Koreans, and Arab/West Asians.

### Highlights:

- 55.3% of the residents of Streetsville indicated that English was their mother tongue (first language).
- The number of people with English as their first language increased by 23.4%, while the number of those with non-English first languages increased by 49.4%.
- In 2001, the top five mother tongue languages after English were Chinese, Punjabi, Portuguese, Arabic, and Polish.
- The greatest population increase occurred among Arabic-speakers (166.7%), Polish-speakers (120.9%) and Urdu-speakers (100.0%).

### Highlights:

- In 2001, the labour force in Streetsville consisted of 31,295 persons over age 15, an increase of 35.5% over the 23,100 persons in the labour force in 1996.
- The labour force participation rate for Streetsville in 2001 was 73.2% compared to 74.0% in 1996. The comparative rate for Peel in 2001 was 73.5%.
- In 2001, there were 29,745 people employed in Streetsville, an increase of 38.1% from the 21,535 employed people in 1996.
- Streetsville's unemployment rate in 2001 for people aged 15 and over was 5.0%, down from the 1996 rate of 6.8%. By comparison, in Peel in 2001, the unemployment rate was 5.1%.

- Overall in Streetsville, families with higher incomes are growing at a faster rate than families with lower incomes.
- The highest rate of growth occurred among families that earned \$50,000 and over. This group increased by 50.3% between 1995 and 2000, from 7,685 to 11,550.
- In 2000, 74.8% of families in Streetsville earned more than \$50,000 per year, compared to 68.2% in 1995.
- The remaining family income groups also increased: the number of families that earned less than \$20,000 increased by 0.5%, and the number of families that earned \$20,000 to \$49,999 increased by 11.9%.

### Highlights:

- The number of individuals in private households living on low incomes increased by 10.2% between 1995 and 2000.
- The number of families living on low incomes increased by 3.5% between 1995 and 2000.
- Overall, the incidence of low income among individuals and families in Streetsville declined between 1995 and 2000.
- In 2000, there were approximately 5,255 persons in private households living on low incomes. The 5,255 low-income persons represented approximately 9.5% of the total population in 2000, compared to 11.5% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 1,230 low-income families in Streetsville. The 1,230 families comprised approximately 8.5% of the total number of families in Streetsville, compared to 10.3% in 1995.
- In 2000, there were 520 unattached individuals living on low incomes in Streetsville compared to 565 in 1995. They represented 22.4% of all unattached individuals in Streetsville in 2000.
- There was a higher incidence of low income among unattached individuals than among families in 2000: 22.4% versus 8.5%, respectively.
