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INTRODUCTION

This report provides factual data on visible minority groups in Peel, based on the 2001 Canadian Census. Under the *Employment Equity Act* of Canada, “visible minorities” are persons, other than Aboriginal persons, who are not White in race or colour. There are nine officially designated visible minority groups in Canada: Blacks, Chinese, South Asians, Filipinos, Latin Americans, Arabs-West Asians, South East Asians, Koreans, and Japanese.

Format

This resource document provides statistical profiles and maps of the Visible Minority Groups in Peel. Data is presented in two formats: fact sheets and maps. These tools are “update-able” (using future Census data) and can be posted on websites for downloading.

Sources of Data

The following data sources were used in the preparation of this report:

- Statistics Canada, Census of Canada, 1996; 2001; 2006.
- Statistics Canada, Census 2001, Special Custom Cross-Tabulation.
- Social Planning Council of Peel Reports from 2004 to 2007.

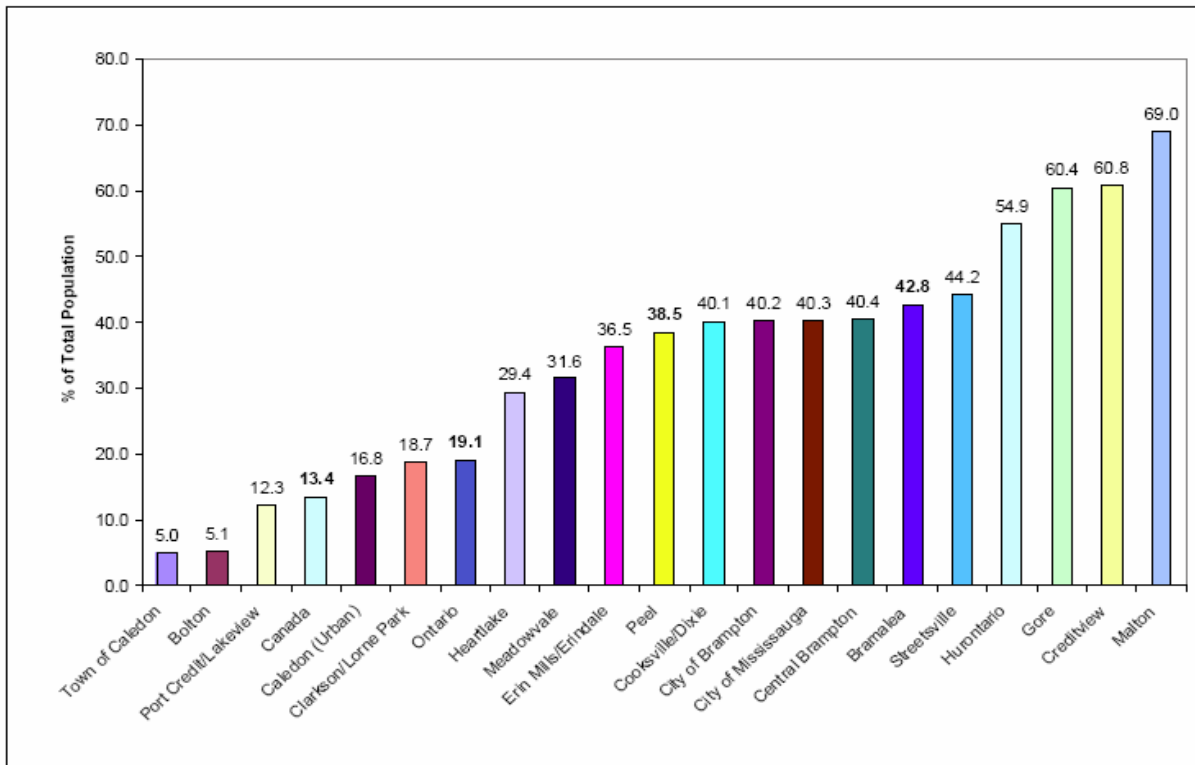

1. The Visible Minority Population in Peel

VISIBLE MINORITY GROUPS IN PEEL, 2001 MAJOR HIGHLIGHTS:

- ◆ Peel is more racially diverse than Ontario and Canada.
- ◆ In 2001, Peel had 38.5% of its population reporting themselves as visible minorities, compared to 19.1% in Ontario and 13.4% in Canada.
- ◆ In 2001, Mississauga and Brampton had almost equal proportions of visible minorities within their total populations, (40.3% and 40.2% respectively). Only 5% of Caledon's population were visible minorities.
- ◆ At the neighbourhood level, Malton, Creditview, and Gore had the highest proportions of visible minorities in 2001. Outside of Caledon, the neighbourhoods with the lowest proportions of visible minorities were Port Credit/Lakeview, Clarkson/Lorne Park, and Heartlake.
- ◆ In 2001, the three largest groups of visible minorities in Peel were South Asians (155,055), Blacks (70,695), and Chinese (41,605).

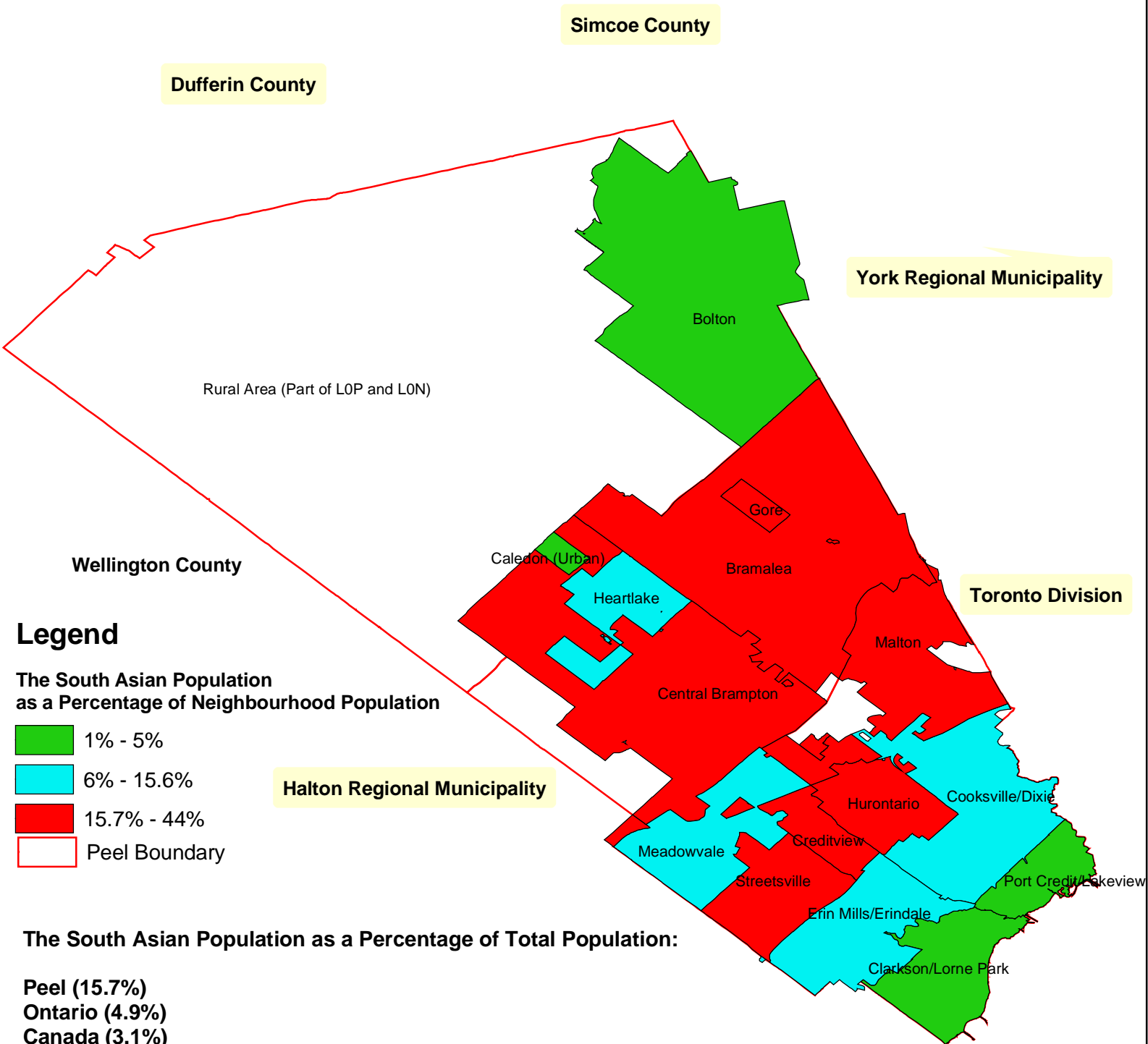

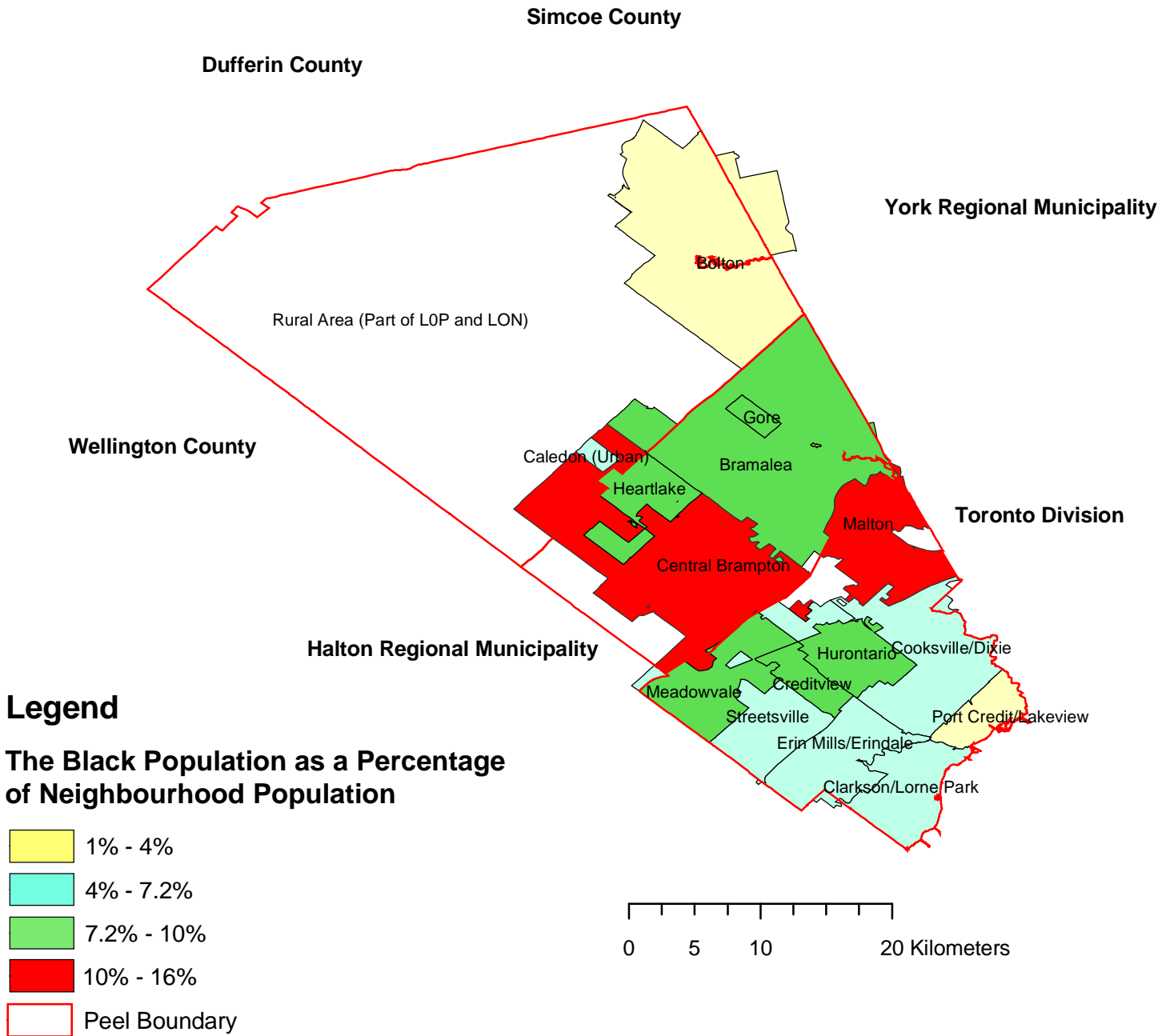

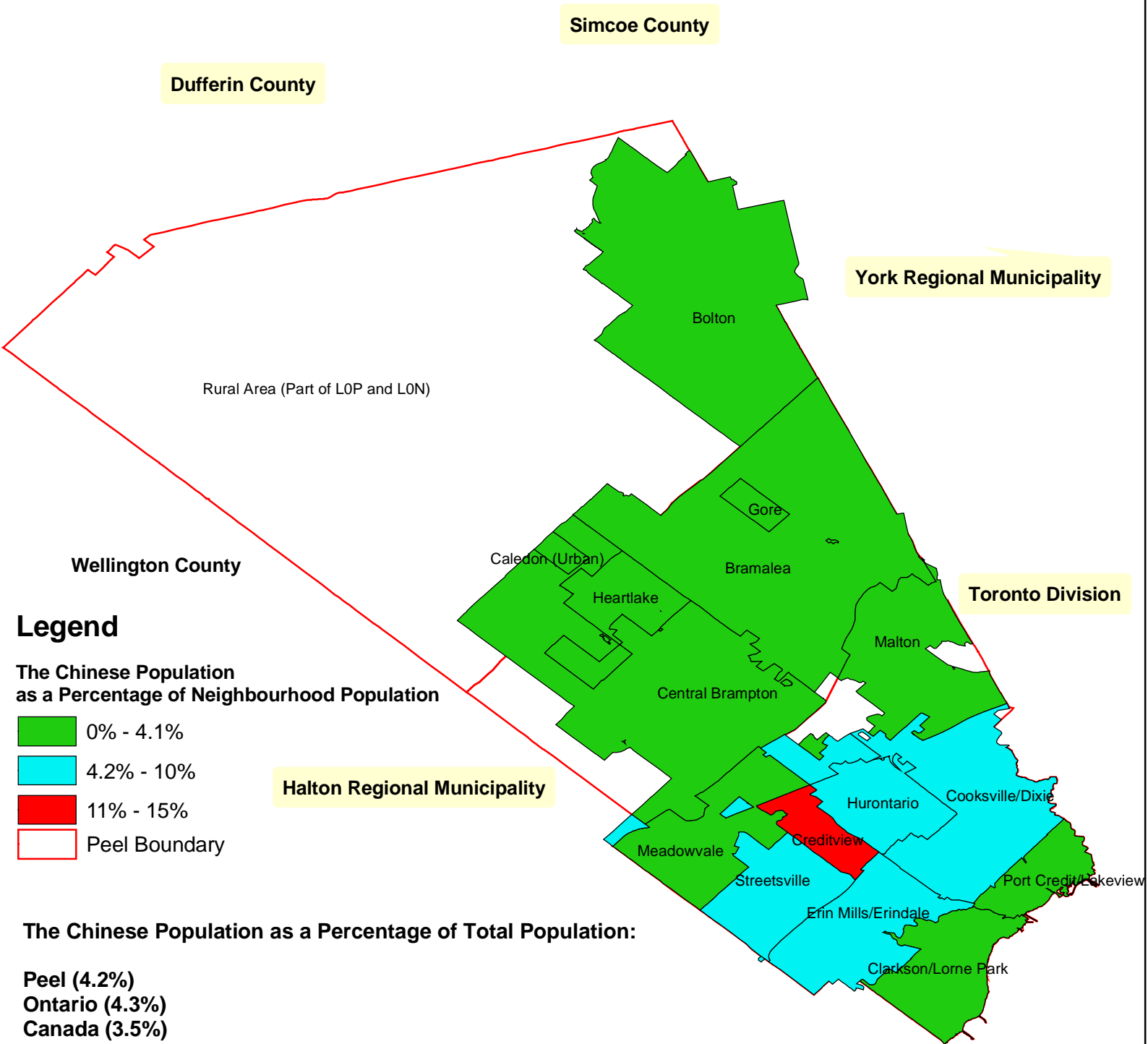

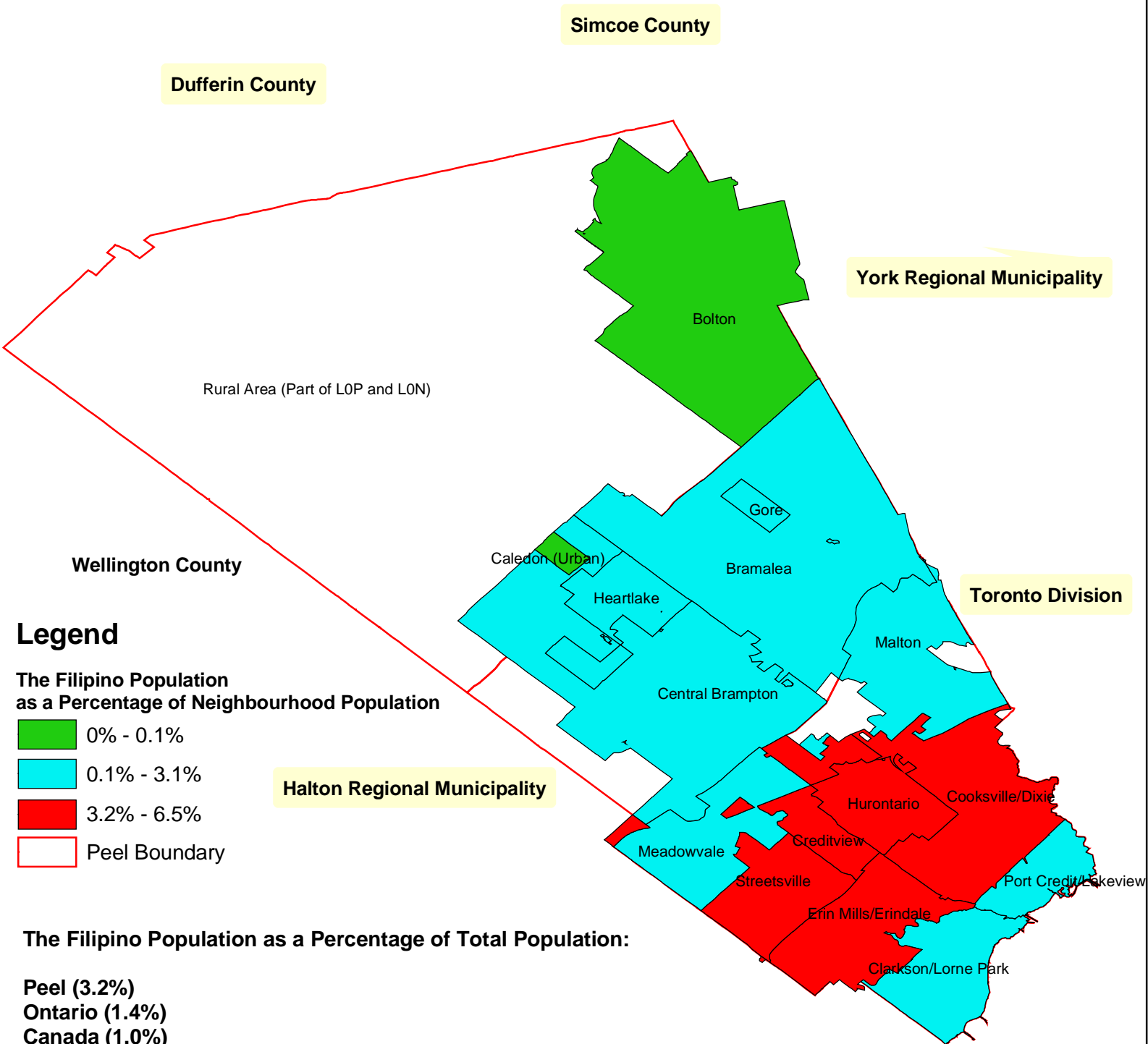

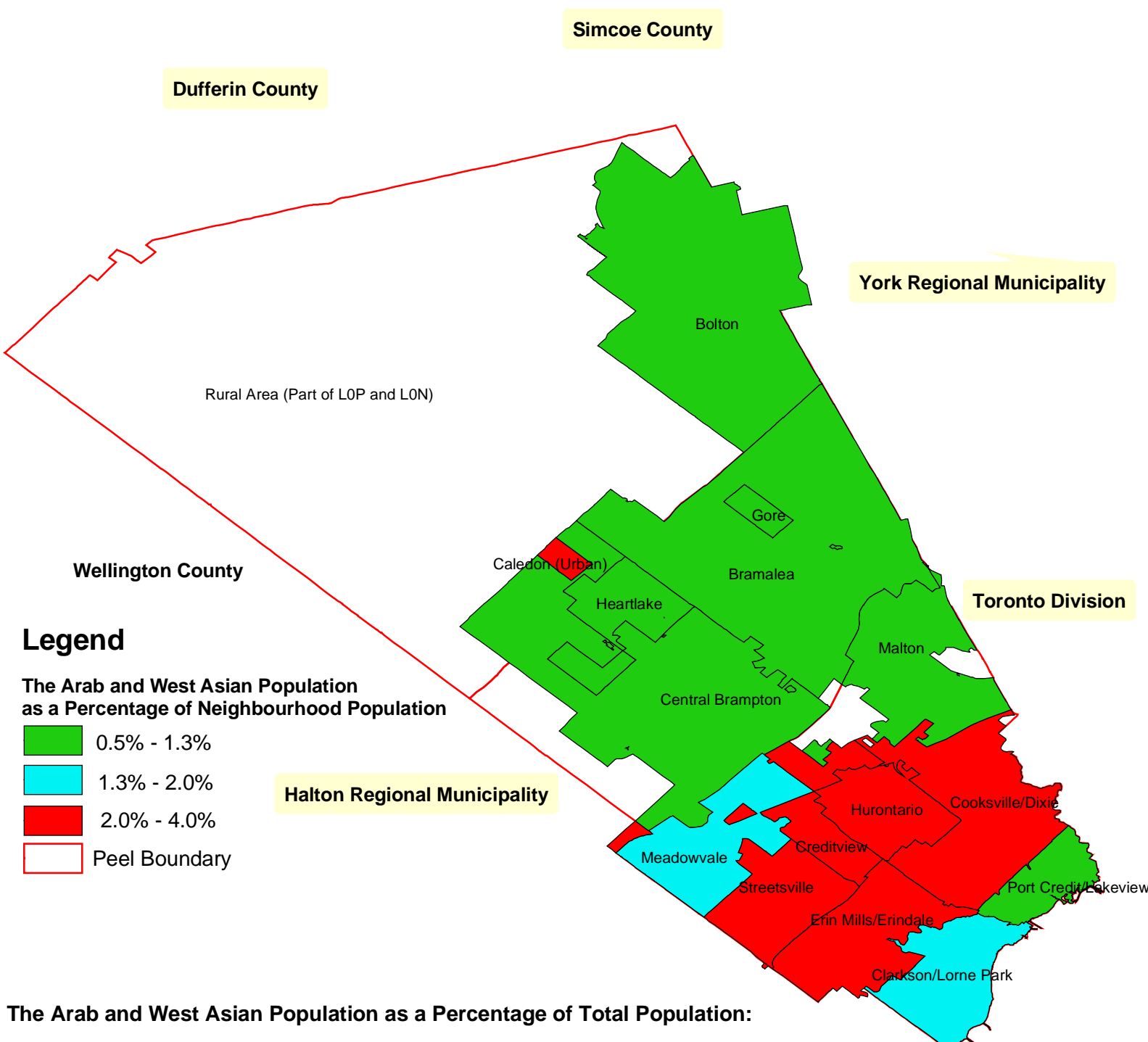

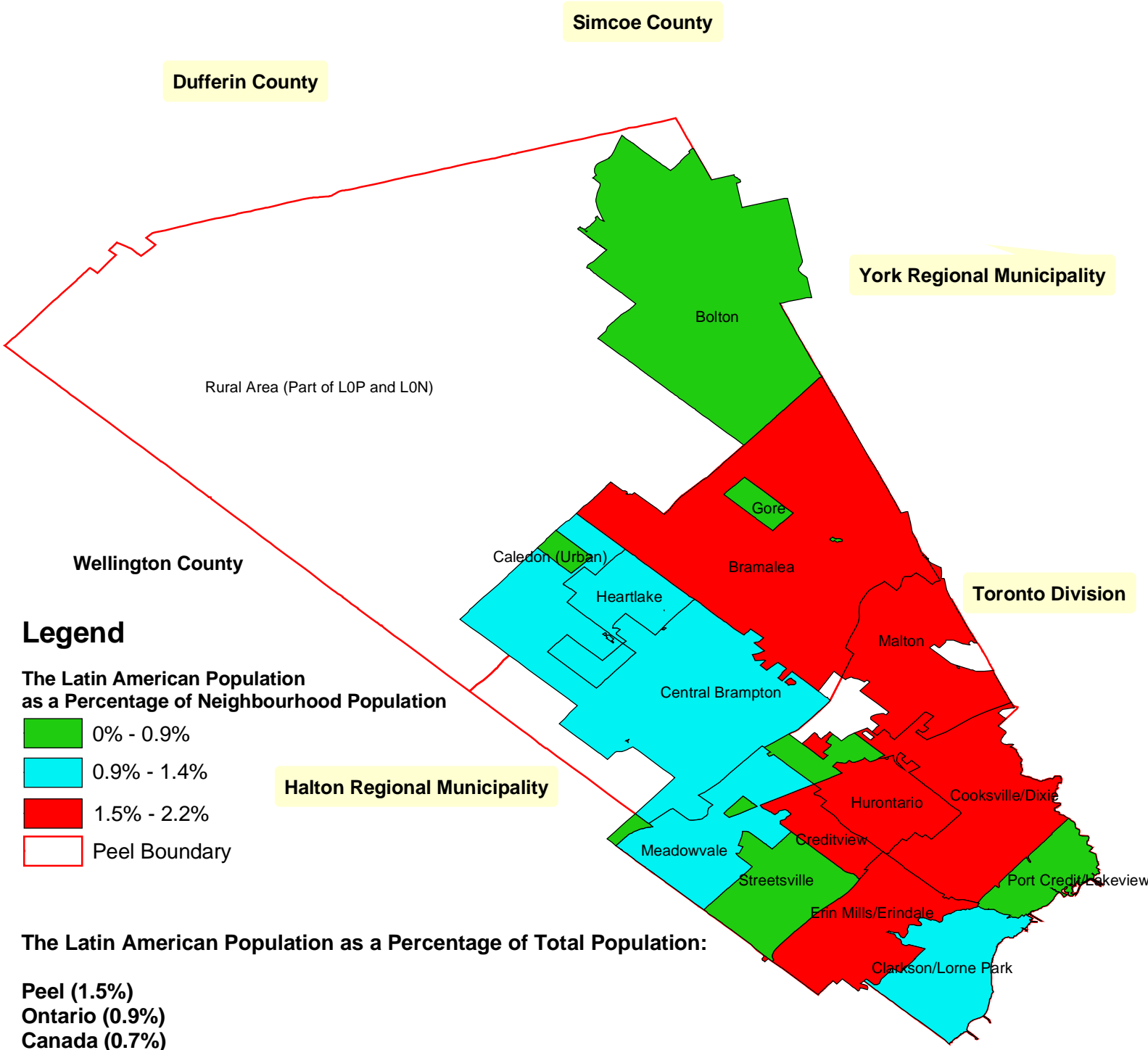

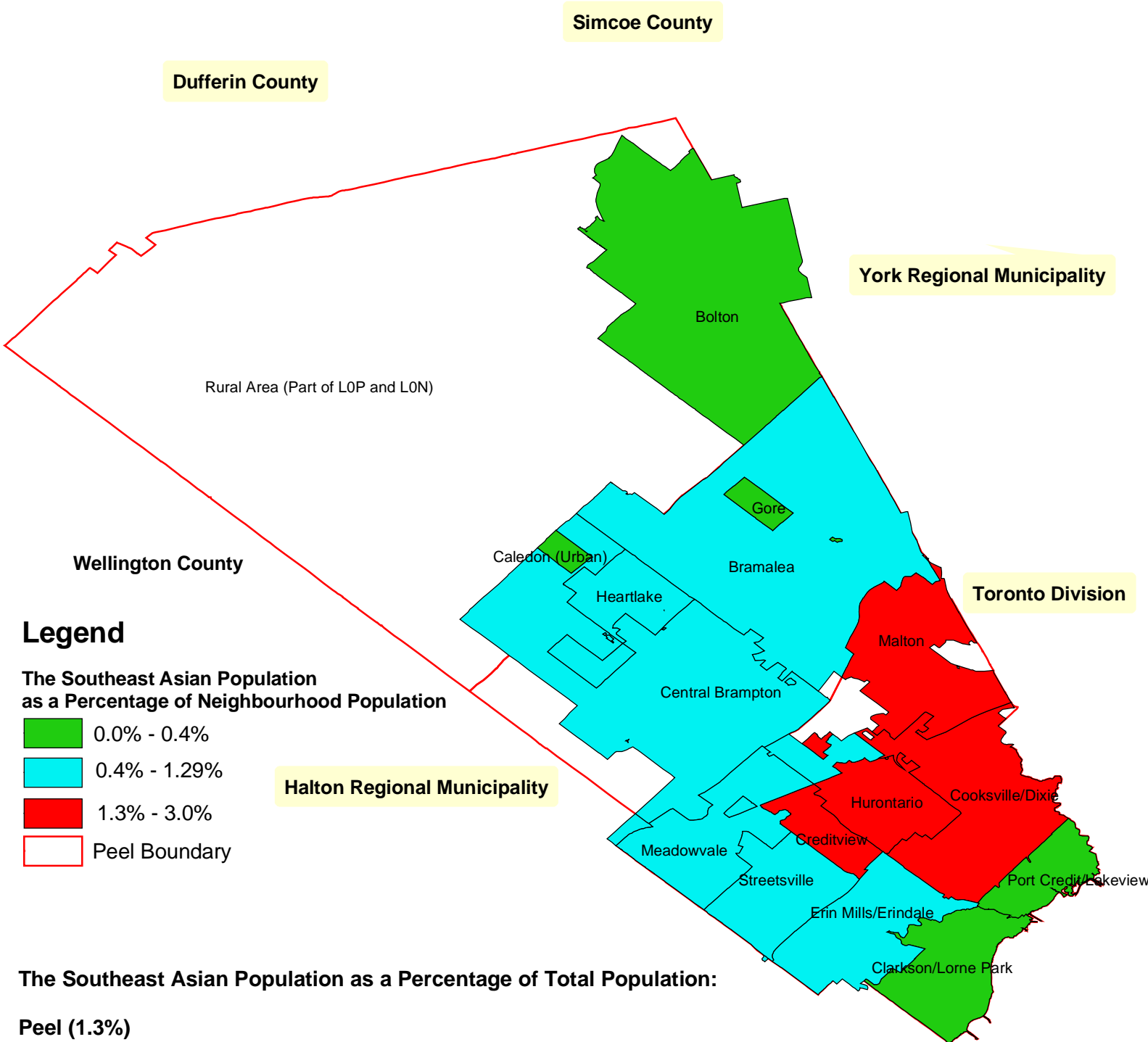

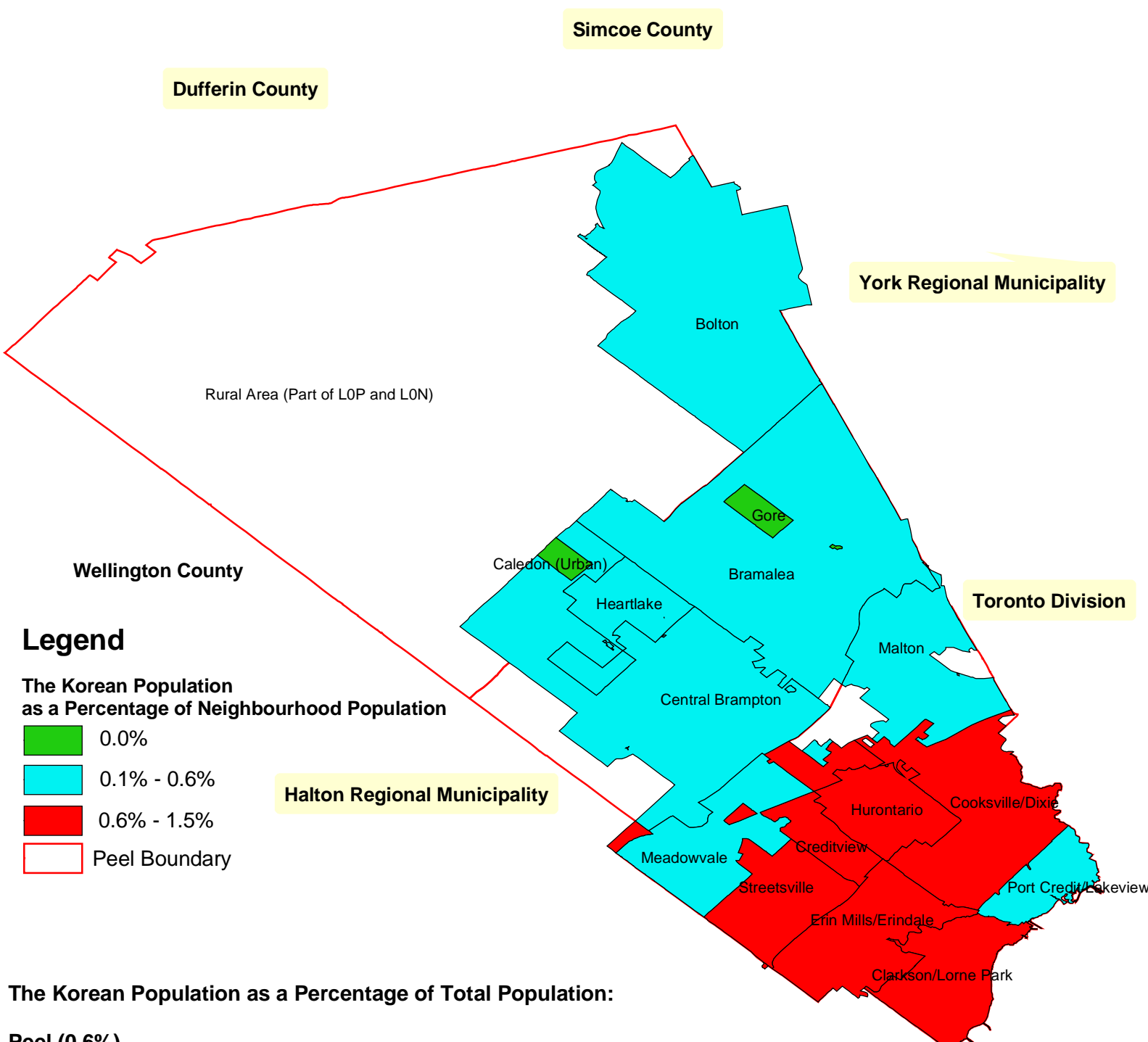

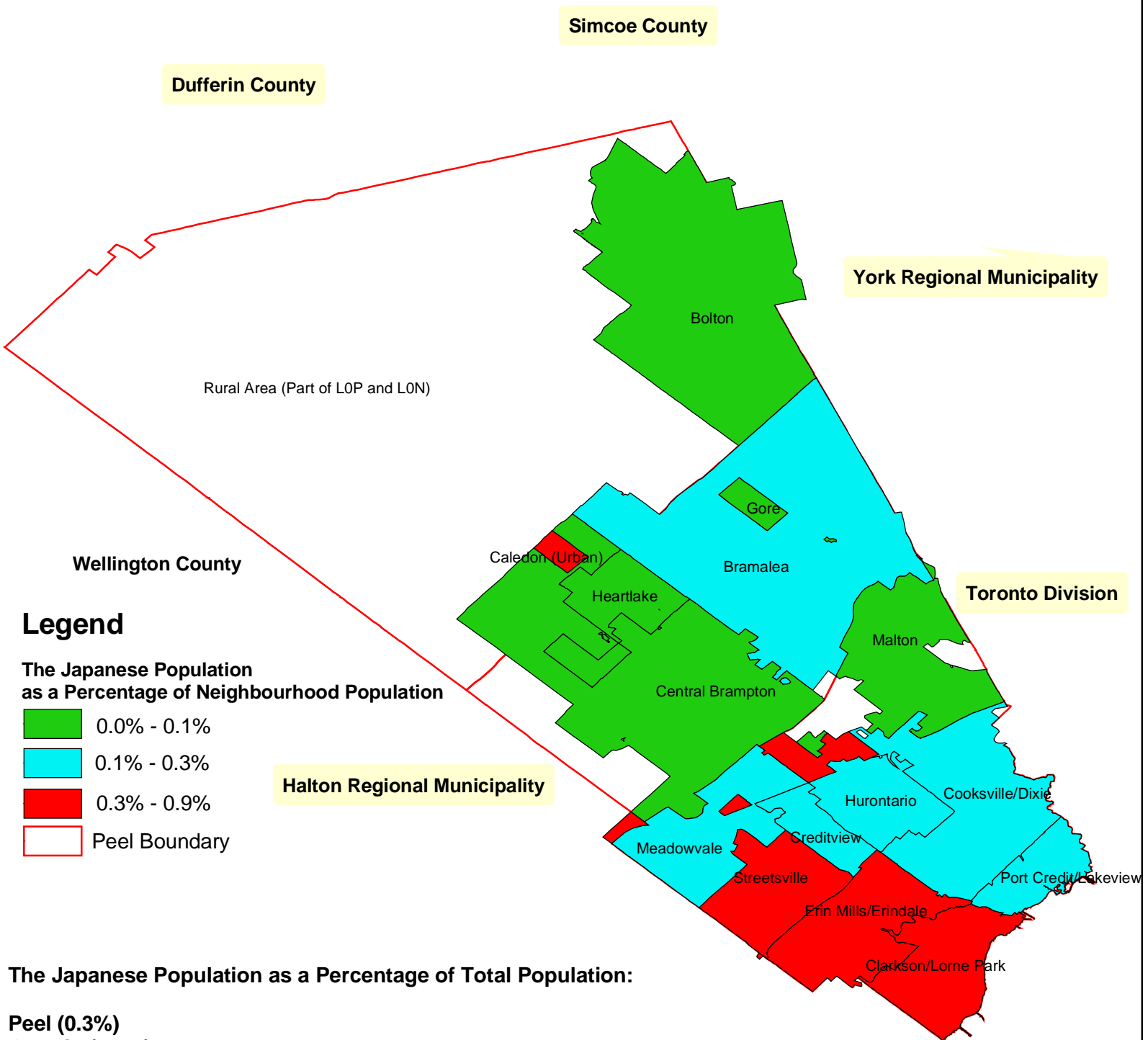

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APPENDICES

Appendix-1

Definitions

A. Demographic and Cultural Characteristics

Population Growth

Population growth between 2001 and 2006 is calculated in the following way:

$$[(P2006 - P2001)/(P2001)] \times 100$$

Immigrant Population

People who are or who have ever been landed immigrants. Landed immigrants are people born outside of Canada who have been permitted by immigration authorities to live in Canada permanently; some will have lived in Canada for a number of years, while others have arrived recently.

Visible Minorities

Under the *Employment Equity Act* of Canada, members of visible minorities are persons, other than Aboriginal persons, who are not white in race or colour.

Language (Mother tongue)

Refers to the first language learned at home in childhood and still understood by the individual at the time of the Census.

B. Household and Family Characteristics

Marital Status (Legal)

A person's conjugal status under the law (e.g. single, married, divorced/separated, widowed).

Home Ownership/Occupied Private Dwelling

Refers to a private dwelling in which a person or a group of persons is permanently residing and whether the dwelling is owned or rented by the person(s) living therein.

Census Family

Refers to a married couple (with or without children of either or both spouses), a couple living common-law (with or without children of either or both partners) or a lone parent of any marital status, with at least one child living in the same dwelling. A couple living common-law may be of opposite or same sex. "Children" in a census family include grandchildren living with their grandparent(s) but with no parents present.

C. Socio-Economic Characteristics

Education

Highest level of schooling refers to the highest grade or year of elementary or secondary (high) school attended, or to the highest year of college or university education completed. University education is considered to be a higher level of schooling than college education.

Employment

- Labour force refers to all persons, 15 years of age and over, excluding institutional residents, who were either employed or unemployed during the week (Sunday to Saturday) prior to Census day.
- Participation rate refers to the total labour force, expressed as a percentage of the population 15 years of age and over.
- Employment rate refers to the number of persons employed, expressed as a percentage of the total population 15 years of age and over.
- Unemployment rate refers to the unemployed labour force expressed as a percentage of the total labour force.

Income

- Income refers to money received from the following sources by persons 15 years of age and over: wages and salaries; net farm self-employment; net non-farm self-employment income from unincorporated business and/or professional practice; federal Child Tax benefits; Old Age Security pension and Guaranteed Income Supplement; benefits from Canada Pension Plan; benefits from Unemployment Insurance; other income from government sources; investment income; retirement pensions, and other money income.

- Low Income Cut-offs (LICOs): Income levels at which families or unattached individuals spend 20% more than average on food, shelter and clothing. The following is Statistics Canada's 2000 matrix of low income cut-offs:
