INTRODUCTION

Background/Rationale

This document is one of the resource materials prepared for the *Advancing Cultural Diversity in Volunteer Management in the 905 and 519 Regions in Ontario* project.

Purpose of Project

- To improve the capacity of voluntary community organizations in the 905 and 519 Regions in Ontario to be reflective and inclusive of the diverse cultural groups in their communities.
- To build an inter-Regional approach for supporting and sustaining cultural diversity in community organizations and communities as a whole.

This project addresses the need of organizations in the voluntary sector to be reflective and inclusive of diverse groups in their local communities, especially in relation to developing a diverse volunteer work force. The focus is on voluntary organizations in the 905 and 519 Regions where the immigrant populations are relatively large and rapidly growing. One of the major assets or contributions of this project is its scope and potential impact. This project will be implemented in Regions with approximately 3,822,112 persons or 31.4% of the Ontario population (Source: Statistics Canada, Census 2006). Furthermore, the process and deliverables of this project can be replicated in other parts of the province (and Canada as a whole).

Purpose of Resource Document

Primary: To provide official, factual data on immigration, ethno-cultural and racial diversity within selected areas of the 905 and 519 Regions in Ontario.

Selected 905 Regions: Peel, Halton, Durham and York Selected 519 Regions: Kitchener-Waterloo, Guelph and London

Secondary: To enable community-based organizations and volunteer-based groups to understand the extent of ethno-cultural and racial diversity within their communities for the purpose of making their organizations diverse, socially inclusive and capable of providing culturally appropriate services.

Format

This resource document provides statistical profiles and maps of the Immigrant and Visible Minority Populations in Selected 905 and 519 Regions. Each geographic area is described separately and in detail. Data is presented in two formats: fact sheets and maps. These tools are update-able and can be posted on websites for downloading.

Sources of Data

Data were collected from the following secondary data sources:

- Statistics Canada, Census of Canada, 2001; 2006;
- Statistics Canada, Census 2001, Special Custom Cross-Tabulation.

(Please note that all Visible Minority Population figures are for residents in private households. Totals may not exactly equal the sum of their components due to rounding.)

- Community service organizations in the voluntary sector in the 519 and 905 Regions.
- Small to medium-sized community-based organizations.







IMMIGRANTS: YORK REGIONAL MUNICIPALITIES, 2001 (Total Immigrants = 283,790)




















IMMIGRANTS: WATERLOO REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY, 2001











<u>APPENDIX</u>

Glossary

A. Demographic and Cultural Characteristics

Population Growth

Population growth between 2001 and 2006 is calculated in the following way: [(P2006 – P2001)/(P2001)] X100

Immigrant Population

People who are or who have ever been landed immigrants. Landed immigrants are people born outside of Canada who have been permitted by immigration authorities to live in Canada permanently; some will have lived in Canada for a number of years, while others have arrived recently.

Visible Minorities

Under the *Employment Equity Act* of Canada, members of visible minorities are persons, other than Aboriginal persons, who are not white in race or colour.

Language (Mother tongue)

Refers to the first language learned at home in childhood and still understood by the individual at the time of the Census.

B. Household and Family Characteristics

Marital Status (Legal)

A person's conjugal status under the law (e.g. single, married, divorced/separated, widowed).

Home Ownership/Occupied Private Dwelling

Refers to a private dwelling in which a person or a group of persons is permanently residing and whether the dwelling is owned or rented by the person(s) living therein.

Census Family

Refers to a married couple (with or without children of either or both spouses), a couple living common-law (with or without children of either or both partners) or a lone parent of any marital status, with at least one child living in the same dwelling. A couple living common-law may be of opposite or same sex. "Children" in a census family include grandchildren living with their grandparent(s) but with no parents present.

C. Socio-Economic Characteristics

Education

Highest level of schooling refers to the highest grade or year of elementary or secondary (high) school attended, or to the highest year of college or university education completed. University education is considered to be a higher level of schooling than college education.

Employment

- Labour force refers to all persons, 15 years of age and over, excluding institutional residents, who were either employed or unemployed during the week (Sunday to Saturday) prior to Census day.
- Participation rate refers to the total labour force, expressed as a percentage of the population 15 years of age and over.
- Employment rate refers to the number of persons employed, expressed as a percentage of the total population 15 years of age and over.
- Unemployment rate refers to the unemployed labour force expressed as a percentage of the total labour force.

Income

• Income refers to money received from the following sources by persons 15 years of age and over: wages and salaries; net farm self-employment; net non-farm self-employment income from unincorporated business and/or professional practice; federal Child Tax benefits; Old Age Security pension and Guaranteed Income Supplement; benefits from Canada Pension Plan; benefits from Unemployment Insurance; other income from government sources; investment income; retirement pensions, and other money income. Low Income Cut-offs (LICOs): Income levels at which families or unattached individuals spend 20% more than average on food, shelter and clothing. The following is Statistics Canada's 2000 matrix of low income cut-offs:
